Some song pieces may have a little dance choreography, while other pieces will only require singing and no choreography. It's enough to keep them entertained, and even the boys love it! I usually do a Contemporary Christian theme in the spring for the recital. Past years performances have been Jump 5, Avalon, and Toby Mac songs.
